Target public

Linguistic support courses in French as a Foreign Language (FLE) are intended for foreign degree students on the Pont de Bois Campus and those on degree and masters courses on the Cité Scientifique Campus.

Course objectives

These courses have been designed to meet the **linguistic needs** of students wishing to hone their French language learning and practice.

The work offered is based on oral and written passive, active and interaction activities, with **authentic documents** in support, such as televised reports and press articles.

The objective is **to improve written and oral expression in a university context**, for examinations and also in a more informal context, which will be helpful in the day-to-day life of the foreign student

Teaching focuses on **linguistic** knowledge, such as lexical development, syntax, the use and morphology of tenses and on **cultural** knowledge by means of intercultural classes and the study of France and its socio-cultural aspects. It is also designed to develop **know-how** by oral and written passive, active and interaction activities with specific work on argumentation.

At the intermediate and advanced levels, i.e. B2 and C1, students are also offered work on the **methodology of university work**: the summary, abstract, argued essay, and training in note-taking and presentation

Number of hours

24 hours spread over the semester during the slots allocated for languages.

Schedule

Two sessions per academic year: September and February. Registration essential. The schedule of tests, lessons, examinations and retakes is passed to the secretariats of the components and the International Relations department, for information and display. Assessment methods

Regular attendance at lessons is strongly recommended. A minimum of 18 of the 24 hours. This minimum number of hours is obligatory for students on exchange programmes.

The final grade out of 20, including continuous assessment, hours of guided independent learning and the final written exam.

Crédits ECTS

3 credits for students on the Pont de Bois, Moulins and Ronchin Santé Campuses, and **2 credits** for students on the Cité Scientifique Campus.

The teaching staff organise the **consultation** of copies. A **retake** is organised. The award of a **certificate of achievement** stating the number of hours of attendance and **the number of credits obtained** or an attendance certificate for students not passing the exam.
